Minutes from Fall Rally 2019

Fall Rally, September 19, 2019 "An Unchanging God in an Everchanging World"

For I the LORD do not change; therefore you. O children of Jacob, are not consumed. Malachi 3:6

The rally was called to order by President Rodenburg and an opening prayer was said in unison. Rev. Gaylord Spilker offered a brief morning devotion in which he noted that though change is all around us----buildings, relationships, etc.----God does NOT change. His love is the one constant in our lives. We were then welcomed to Trinity, Edinburg by committee chairman, Pam Spilker. President Rodenburg led us in the pledge to our national flag and to the Christian flag.

Our speaker, Laura Strattman, CID Human Care Chairman, was introduced by Pam Gross, Zone Vice President. Her talk was on <u>Change is good – You go first!</u> We like the results of change but we don't like to do it. But, if we don't like change, we are going to like irrelevance less. She used the Chouletecal Bridge as a graphic example. Much time and money went into it's building. Then, when a hurricane hit; the bridge survived----but the river moved. Classic irrelevance. Although each generation imagines itself to be more intelligent than the prior generation, they irrationally think they are more intelligent than the next generation. After a discussion of the differences between Boomers, Gen X'ers, Gen Y millenials, and Gen Z, including their preferred methods of communication; she concluded that we can't stop change. Instead, we need to deal with it. Our resistance is similar to other forms of grief with all the stages from denial to acceptance. Throughout the history of the church, it has had to deal with change. As we try to

adapt, we will have failures. Failure is not a sin but a learning experience. Change is not a one time deal. Our world continues to change. Remember, the river has moved. Adapt! Fail "early and often" and learn from it. We need to lead the charge to revitalize our LWML.

After a short break, the offering for CID was collected and "Lutheran Women, One and All was sung accompanied by Susie Suggs followed by greetings from the Central Illinois District brought by Rev. Miller.

Rev. Tim Hahn, District Sr. Counselor, led a Bible study on "A Never-changing God in an Ever-changing World." We looked at various things that change including one that we cannot change—sin. And he discussed the change our God makes in us as He transforms us.

After the LWML pledge, Pam Spilker introduced our Honorary Speaker, Connie Harter Matovu. She volunteers with Hospice Africa Uganda in Kampala as a Social Worker. She spoke about her work and about the Lutheran Seminary in Uganda. Because only 30 ordained ministers are attempting to care for 140 congregations, there is a great need for additional ministers. They currently have 48 students, almost no furniture, and only a very minimal library. Part of our ingathering was books for the library.

President Rodenburg opened the business meeting by inviting the audience to look over the secretary and treasurer's report. Roll call was answered by 14 societies.

Mary Denham presented the slate for election. President Rodenburg was re-elected by acclamation. Judy Carlson was elected by acclamation as Secretary/Treasurer.

Dawn Zerkel, District Vice President for Christian Life spoke about the National Convention in Mobile and various district activities. The CID Convention will be in Morton in the spring—April 30-May 2. In addition to being 3 days instead of 2, it will feature a convention choir, Thursday community service events, Friday Bible study and an evening banquet, and regular convention activities on Saturday. Our zone is in charge of the Silent Auction. She encouraged us to come and bring a friend---maybe a young woman. District is underwriting cost of the banquet so they can keep registration costs to \$25. Mission Grant Forms are due October 31. She also solicited nominations for District officers. The National website has been revamped (LWML.org) and also the District site (LWMLCID.org)

President Rodenburg gave the ZONE President's Report. She has forms for the various units. Angel Tree will be sponsored again with the party on December 8 at Our Savior's in Springfield. The Grandmother/Mother/Daughter Tea and Style Show will also be repeated on Sunday, March 15 at Trinity in Springfield with a Diaper Shower to benefit the Parent Place. She thanked the society presidents in the zone for their hard work and cooperation.

Attendance of 63 members, 1 guest, and 11 pastors was reported. The offering for CID was \$444.00. The Ingathering included 307 items for the food pantry and many hundreds of books for the Uganda Seminary.

After the Ingathering Litany, Rev. Hahn installed President RoDenburg and Secretary-Treasurer,

Judy Carlson.

Cheryl Long invited everyone to the 2020 Fall Rally in St. John's New Berlin.

Motion to adjourn. Passed.

Closing hymn, "Serve the Lord with Gladness" was sung. A luncheon prayer was offered.
