The last six weeks of our fiscal year proved just how wonderfully God works through the women of the LWML. The challenge was set to the board at the February board meeting that we were about \$30,000 short of our mite goal. That meant that we needed \$10,000 a week to meet our mission goal! That was certainly a challenge! The women of the LWML Central Illinois District proved they were up to the challenge and not only did they meet the mite goal, but they SURPASSED THE MITE GOAL! You are all so very wonderful in all that you do for God and His people. You humble me.

Voting by e-mail the delegates voted to make the mission goal \$105,000 for fiscal year 2021-2022. They chose 6 mission grants to fund this coming year. These mission grants and the bulletin bytes to promote them will be on the website soon. They have already been sent to the zone presidents.

Many of you had "watch parties" for the district convention and collected items for local and national entities. I pray that you enjoyed your fellowship with each other, and God blessed your time together. You certainly are a great gift to all those you serve with your time, talents, and mites. I also pray that next year we can be together in Springfield for our 77th District Convention. I missed seeing all of you in person.

Our next big event will be the National LWML Convention in Lexington, Kentucky from June 24th through the 27th. Those of you attending as delegates will be voting for mission grants online this next week. All those who are attending will get to see the awesome ways that God uses our mites throughout the world. For those of you who are unable to attend, the convention will be live, and you may watch it as it happens. The mission walk will also have a virtual component to it this year. If you would like to do a walk with your groups to help raise mite dollars, please go to LWML.org and look under the Convention Central tab to see how you may participate. Those submitting pictures of their walk before June 4th will get to be at the convention by photo! You may also give convention offerings to the 4 recipients online. Go under the same tab for this information.

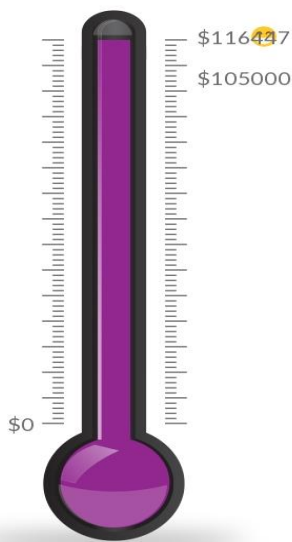
