#### **President Laura's Post**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I write to you while overlooking some of the beautiful architecture in Milwaukee, WI. Last evening, I had the privilege of worshipping with a couple thousand of my fellow Lutherans for the second time in as many months! What a wonderful worship service it was! There were more male voices in the crowd this time! "We Preach Christ Crucified" is the theme for the synodical convention. Why is this so important? Unless we realize that we are all sinners and fail to meet the expectations of our Almighty God, we will never value the ultimate sacrifice that Jesus Christ made on our behalf that first Good Friday. His victory over sin, death, and the power of the devil with His resurrection that first Easter Sunday allows us to live for Him and to die in Him. Our eternal life with Him in heaven is the reason we, as Lutheran Women in Mission, strive to spread the gospel to all nations! We want everyone to have that same joy and confidence in their salvation! All that we do as Lutheran Women in Mission in service to others opens relationships to bring the Gospel to them so they may have the same hope we have.

Beginning September 12, our Fall Rallies will start throughout the district. The theme this year is "Abound in Love for One Another" based on John 13:34 "...Love one another just as I have loved you..." (NEV). Our presenters will be Rev. Rodney Blomquist who will inform us on the prison ministry throughout CID which focuses on loving all people, just as Christ loved us. Our other presenters will be from the Orphan Grain Train who will tell how the Gospel is spread through acts of mercy shown to the recipients of our gifts. Please be sure and attend, pray and worship with your sisters! I hope to see many of you there!

LWML Sunday is usually celebrated on the first Sunday in October, though it may be celebrated anytime. This years' theme is "The King is Coming" based on Psalm 24:7-10. The materials should be on the lwml.org website shortly. Please be sure and let the women (and men) know who you are as Lutheran Women in Mission. Tell them about our district mission grants and national grants. Tell them about the resources available to them on the website. Invite your friends personally to the LWML Rally in your zone, explaining to them what the rallies are for and what we do. Tell them about ingatherings that show love to our communities, prayer, and Bible Studies with our sisters in Christ.

October 6-7, 2023, is the date for the Fall Retreat at Camp CILCA! "Journey to Faith: The Trip of a Lifetime" is the theme for the weekend. Plan on attending this Bible studying, faith building, and fellowship enhancing weekend! There are fun events included in this retreat, and of

course, there is always good food! The registration form is included in this Clarion and will be on the website. Deadline to register is September 22, 2023. As they say, "the more the merrier!" Hope to see you there.

The 79th LWML CID Convention will be held April 26, & 27, 2024 at Immanuel Lutheran Church at 3300 24th St. Rock Island, IL 61201-6212. The theme will be "Hark, the Voice of Jesus Calling" based on Luke 10:2 "And he said to them, the harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." Save the date now! Plan on coming with your friends on Friday for the afternoon servant events. Afterwards, gather for a wonderful worship service and fellowship with your sisters throughout the district. On Saturday, you can enjoy the convention Bible study, singing, speakers, and breakout sessions. Volunteer to be a delegate from your church to vote on mission grants that will be selected for the upcoming year. Help shape the future of the LWML CID!

Speaking of Officers, there are several officer positions that will be voted for in this upcoming convention. We will be voting on a new President, Vice President of Christian Life, Vice President of Communication, Financial Secretary, and a Junior Pastoral Counselor. Do you hear the voice of Jesus' calling? Do you know someone with the skills needed for these positions that may be able to assist the LWML CID go forward in its mission to "Joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others?" (LWML Mission statement) You may find out what these positions entail by visiting the lwmlcid.org website and looking in the guidelines, or by asking your zone president for a nomination form. If you think that you might want to serve on the board for the next President, please let your zone president know so that she may pass that information along. Pray that God would point you to the path that He wants you on. Candidate suggestions are due by October 31, 2023.

As LWML wishes to engage with our Church Workers in the district, I would direct your attention to the lwml.org website to pursue ways to support the church workers in your church. Search for the document "Ideas for the LWML Districts to Support, Encourage, and Care for Church Workers. One way to do this is to support your Pastor's wife. The annual Pastor's wives Retreat will be held at Camp CILCA on October 13-14, 2023. Soon the pastor's wives will be getting an invitation to the event. Sharla Fritz will be presenting "Enough for Now". She is a Pastor's wife from Aurora, IL and a wonderful Bible Study leader and writer. My prayer is that your group would offer to financially support your pastor's wife to attend this retreat. Understanding that some groups may not be able to do this, please encourage your congregation in their financial support for her. Your pastor's wife is an integral part of his life, his support and helpmate. Although she does not have the call to your church, her life is very much attached to his call. This retreat will offer her an opportunity to be with other women who understand her role and be an encouragement to her when needed. Be sure and include any widowed and emeritus pastor's wives, they have fought the good fight, and we gain knowledge from them.

There is much information in this article, and I would hope that you will mark your calendars with dates of opportunities to be with your sisters in Christ. I ask you to continue in your prayers for the LWML CID. 
#### Effingham - Shelby Zone

#### **Danville Zone**


